Getting to the Birmingham Women's Hospital

By Road	Birmingham Women's Hospital is located in Edgbaston and is easily accessible from Birmingham city center via the A38 Bristol Road. The hospital is within easy access of Junction 4 of the M5 motorway. The Hospital is situated next to University Hospital Birmingham. Follow road signs. Signs may refer to Queen Elizabeth Hospital Birmingham.
Car	Nearest car park to the Women's Hospital is Car Park D (See attached Map).
<u>Parking</u>	Once you come out of the car park, turn right and the women's Hospital is in view at the top of the road.

By Bus

Birmingham Women's Hospital is served by a number of bus routes that stop outside the main entrance at University Hospital Birmingham (QEHB)or are a short walk from the hospital on New Fosse Way. Walk up the slope heading away from the QEHB main entrance and past the Harborne Hospital. Cross the pelican crossing to Birmingham Women's Hospital.

By Rail

The closest railway station to QEHB is University, which is around five minutes' walk from the hospital.

University railway station is on the Cross-City and Cross-Country line. There are trains approximately every 15 minutes from Birmingham New Street towards Bromsgrove or Redditch. Certain services from Birmingham New Street towards Hereford and Cardiff also stop at University.

The station does not have any parking available. It has step-free access for those with limited mobility.
